

Pancha Mahā Yajña

- Daily Duty- 1: Brahma Yajña: Study of the teachings of the sages and cultivate devotion to the supreme reality.
- Daily Duty-2: **Deva Yajña:** HAVAN or HOMA, in the course of which Ghee and other odoriferous, nutritious, and sugary substances are offered in to the fire to the accompaniment of Vedic mantras.
- Daily Duty-3: Pitr Yajña: Caring for our parents and elders.
- Daily Duty-4: Atithi Yajña: Serving unexpected visitors and doing philanthropic activities.
- Daily Duty-5: **Bhūta Yajña**: Feeding and caring for animals, planting trees and protecting them.



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
